President's Message

We have just past the midpoint of the winter. The daylight seems to come earlier and last longer each day. There is just a couple weeks left before trout season closes on many rivers. In about one month the DEP will begin stocking the year round TMA's and fishing season will officially open in about two months. If you haven't stocked up on your fishing supplies, or tied those spring flies, now is the time to do it.

I would like to thank everyone who took the time to mail in your written testimony in support of the DEP's proposed **Stream Flow Regulations.** These regulations are a big step towards healthy trout streams, because dry rivers cannot support trout, and because the existing stream flow regulations do not protect the native and wild trout streams. The proposed regulations could be reasonably implemented over the next ten years because they include a classification system that provides a sliding scale of stream flow protections based on a number of criteria. The importance of the proposed stream flow standards and regulations, cannot be emphasized enough because it mirrors **Trout Unlimited's mission**, to preserve, protect and restore our coldwater resources.

This Thursday Mike Bartolomeo will present his **Saltwater Fly-Fishing Primer** for those who want tips on getting into Saltwater fly-fishing. Our meeting will start with group fly tying at 6:00, food and drinks will be available, while they last, and the presentation will begin after a few announcements at 7:00.

Please consider becoming more involved in the Hammonasset chapter. I hope to see you at our monthly meetings.

Ron Graziani gave a presentation on the basics of ice fishing including the safety of wearing multiple layers to stay warm with a change left in the car; then checking in several places the thickness of the ice from the edge out to your location. The equipment covered various types of tip up and a jigging rod. The importance of letting someone else know where you are going and how long you plan on staying out on the ice went right along with keeping a cell phone dry inside a zip lock bag.

Trout in the Classroom:

Everything is going well, **Bill, Walter, Bruce, Ed** and **Hugh** have been visiting the schools. The teachers have praised the way the program has motivated students. **Justin** gave an update on the DNA tests that the students have performed on trout. Also Ed recognized **Al Sonski** from the Kensington Hatchery who was in attendance for providing eggs to the Cromwell School last January when they got a late start to their tank. A \$15,000 grant will help three states purchase fishing rods for kids. This years Youth Education day at Chatfield Hollow will be to introduce kids from Trout in the Classroom to fishing.

An hour of fly tying:

preceded the meeting with several members tying flies. Also a fly swap will be held each month so members can exchanged flies with other members.

The chapter will pay for all first year youth memberships, to keep the interest alive we are offering this to the youth that attend several meetings.

A ten weight fly rod:

will be raffled off this month; it was donated by **Lindsey Suter** who owns the property on the Farm River where the fish ladder will be built.

Tying with the Vets:


